Here are the 10 most useful features of Photoshop Elements. See also: Exposing Shadows Shadows are strong and represent the underlying area that is relatively darker than the rest of the image. In Elements, you have three exposure tools for Shadows: New Shadow Mode This tool is used to darken the background, which is behind the main subject of an image. Shadow Blend This tool is used to blend the shadows created by New Shadow Mode. Binary Map Shadows Shadows are represented by black in the darkest area and white in the darkest area. With these three shadows tools, you can tone down shadows, lighten shadows or apply a blur to make it look more artistic. Creating Shadows You can use the Shadows/Highlights toolbox in the Shadows menu (Window > Shapes or press Shift+F7) to create shadows. Adding a shadow to an image is really easy. Start by selecting the subject that you want to add shadows to. In the next step, click on the foreground. Do not select a layer. You can also create shadow areas from a selection. Open the Shapes/Highlights Toolbox by pressing Shift+F7. Click on the circle in the toolbox. Go to the Shadows/Highlights menu and click on Shadows. The circle is now a shadow. Make sure to deselect the foreground so the active area is the only area that becomes a shadow. Smudging and Smudging Smudging is essentially using the Dodge (lighter) and Burn (darker) tools. Smudging is great to soften an object, soften an image, create a blurred effect or as a quick fix. In Elements, smudging is the quickest way to soften and blur your image. Open the Shapes/Highlights toolbox by pressing Shift+F7. Click on the soft rubber circle in the toolbox and select one of the four softening options. A circular softening tool that was originally designed for the Dodge tool is available. Do not change the Amount, Soften, and Size of the brush in the Radius box. Make sure only the brush is selected. Using a Soft brush is the easiest way to smudge an image in Elements. Use the Burn and Dodge tools to add different amounts of shadow to 05a79cecff

Q: Adding a GoDaddy Virtual Host Entry in the Root Zone I have a GoDaddy Virtual Host pointing at my domain.com site on my hosting account. What I would like to do is add an entry to the root zone of another domain: subdomain.domain.com. I was unable to figure out how to do this from a GoDaddy account, could anyone offer some advice? I'm looking for the main-domain equivalent of what I see when you go to in your browser (meaning the virtual host settings are in place for subdomain.domain.com.) A: What you want to do is actually two things. Make subdomain.domain.com a CNAME to domain.com. As you have already found. Make the www subdomain of domain.com resolve to subdomain.domain.com. This is all controlled by GoDaddy. You will need to log in to your GoDaddy account, and go to the main zone file (it should be at domain.com/main.php) and change the configuration for the www subdomain so that it does not resolve to domain.com, but instead resolves to www.domain.com. This is as easy as changing the following line: Change it to the following: DocumentRoot /www/domain.com And then, in the DNS settings for your domain, on the A Record for www, change it to point to your server. If you are using a hosting solution that automatically updates the DNS records for you, then you may need to use the Edit Zone button at the bottom of the DNS manager, and change it manually. A: Contrary to what some may expect, India did have a pre-Siddhanta (school of thought) tradition, which the Aryabhatiya postulated (along with the trigonometric system) and which appears in the Brahmanas. The most prominent figure here is probably Patanjali (circa 500 CE), to whom are ascribed the Yoga Sutras and the Brahma-sutras. The former is more or less a philosophical text on yoga, but the latter is made up of various sutras (treatises) on metaphysics and spiritual practices, put together for the benefit of brahmanas. (A quick look at book exchange reveals that the Brahma-sutras are freely available in the East, while the Yoga Sutras are much harder to find, particularly online. That's not to say that the former is not of interest to anybody; it does touch on most subjects that one can think of). (The Yoga Sutras can also be found in a number of translations, see, for example, There are many similarities between Patanjali's work and the Yoga-sutra of the same name, found in the Yogaratnavali, but those are superficial and they are not genuine excerpts from any of these texts.
